Here Chronology is measured based on the year of Indian Independence


Today Christian is the common scale of chronology all over the world.

The period of history is divided into AD and BC based on the birth of Jesus

Christ. The time before and after the birth of Jesus Christ is known as

BC(Before Christ) and AD(Anno Domini) respectively. Now the are also known as

CE(Common Era) and BCE(Before Common Era)



This picture helps us to recognize the concept of AD and BC.

Do you know when it began?

A century denotes 100 years. For example, AD 1 to AD 100 is the first century. AD 1901 to AD 2000 is the 20th century.

Different Eras are mentioned in the Calender. Saka Era is one of it. An ear calculating system, kanisha the king of ushana dnasty began the Saka Era. The 12 months of Saa Era are

- Chaitram
- Vysakham
- Jeshtum
- Ashadam
- Sravanam
- Bhadhrapadam

- Aswinam
- karthika
- Agrahayanam
- Pausham
- Magham
- · Phalgunam.

Saka Era began from 78 AD . It was being recorded in the 'National Calender' from 22nd March 1957
